Mitchell has successfully demonstrated his awareness of different learning styles and has adequately adjusted assignments to meet the varied needs of his students. His units were thoroughly prepared and implemented. He was successful in monitoring and adjusting to various schedule changes in order to complete the required objectives during his time of teaching.

Mitchell's teaching strategy for mathematics focused a great deal on technology. For nearly every lesson, Mitchell instructed the students with the aid of a PowerPoint presentation. At the conclusion of the lesson, he would upload each PowerPoint to his website so that the students could refer back to it if any extra explanation was needed. As well, his website includes a comment section where students were able to post any questions they were struggling with and Mitchell could respond in a timely manner. I found this to be an incredibly successful idea and in fact, it is an idea I have borrowed for myself.

One of Mitchell's most distinct strengths is his ability to extend learning outside of the traditional classroom setting. This semester, he has created several activities that allow the students to get out of their desks and learning specific outcomes in a fun, brain-based activity. I have witnessed first-hand how much enjoyment and knowledge the class has gained from these student-centered activities and I look forward to integrating these into my classes as well.

Mitchell's contributions extended beyond the classroom, as he also devoted his time to helping the LeBoldus extra-curricular community. He helped coach the LeBoldus Girls Soccer team, as well as becoming an advisor for the SRC. Mitchell showed a great willingness to help out and his contributions this semester were definitely appreciated.

I am confident that Mr. Bresciani will be an asset to any staff that he works with. He is confident, knowledgeable, and has the skills of a seasoned teacher.
